



Question 1:

Chip says that sometimes people change pictures or make up stories online, like a "flying dog."

What does this mean?

- A) Everything online is 100% true.
- B) Not everything online is real, so you have to be careful.
- C) Dogs can actually fly if you look on the internet.





Correct Answer: B

Why? Chip says just because something is online doesn't mean it's real. People post things to get clicks or attention.





Question 2:

According to Chip, what are some 'clues' that a story might be fake?

- A) It has weird spelling or sounds 'too good to be true.'
- B) It has a picture of a squirrel in it.
- C) It comes from a trusted school website.





Correct Answer: (A)



Why? If a story looks messy with bad spelling, or sounds impossible (like squirrels in outer space!), it is probably fake.





Question 3: If you see a story from a website you have never heard of before, what does Chip suggest you do first?

- A) Share it with friends.
- B) Check the source or ask an adult.
- C) Believe it immediately.





Correct Answer:



Why? The first rule is to "Check the Source." If you don't know who wrote the story, ask a teacher or parent to help you.
