Question 1:

Chip says that if he sees something strange in the forest, he stops and sniffs. What should YOU do if something online looks weird or 'too good to be true'?

- A) Click it to see what happens.
- B) Stop and check with a grown-up.
- C) Unplug the computer immediately.





Correct Answer: (B)

Why? Just like Chip pauses to sniff, you should pause to think! If it looks confusing or weird, that is your clue to ask for help.





Question 2:

According to Chip, if you ask a parent or teacher for help with something online, what does that mean?

- A) It means you are being smart and safe.
- B) It means you are in big trouble.
- C) It means you aren't good at using the internet.





Correct Answer:

Why? Chip wants you to remember that asking for help doesn't mean you did something wrong. It means you are being a cautious squirrel!





Question 3: If a pop-up suddenly asks for your name or information, what is the rule?

- A) Type your name, but do not type your address.
- B) Do not click or type anything—show an adult right away.
- C) Guess what the answer might be.







Correct Answer: (B)

Why? The recap told us: Stop if it feels weird, and do not click or share info until an adult says it is safe.
