



Question 1: Chip reminds us that when we are online, it is easy to forget something important. What should we always remember?

- B) That there is a real person with feelings reading what we say.
- C) That we need to type as fast as possible.





Correct Answer: (B)

Why? Chip says that mean comments can hurt feelings even through a screen, so we must treat people nicely.





Question 2:

Chip says if you wouldn't say something to a friend's face, you shouldn't post it online. What is this rule called?

- A) Think before you type.
- B) Type without looking.
- C) The silent treatment.







Correct Answer: (A)



Why? Words travel far and fast! If it's not kind enough to say in person, it's not kind enough to type.





Question 3: If you see someone being teased or treated meanly online, Chip says you should be an "Upstander."

What does an Upstander do?

- A) Joins in and teases the person too.
- B) Ignores it and pretends they didn't see anything.
- C) Helps by saying something nice, reporting the mean message, or telling an adult.





Correct Answer: C

Why? An Upstander helps others feel safe. A Bystander just watches, but an Upstander takes action to spread kindness!
