- C) It is sent during the daytime.





Correct Answer: (A)

Why? Chip says to look out for bad spelling and messages that try to scare you into clicking quickly without thinking.





Question 3:

If you receive a message that asks for your password or home address, what is the best thing to do?

- A) Reply and ask them why they want it.
- B) Delete it and don't tell anyone.
- C) Don't click anything and tell a grown-up right away.





Correct Answer: (C



Why? Chip says you should always show a parent, teacher, or trusted adult before you do anything else. They will help you check if it is safe!
